In Brief

The Great Victoria Desert adventure is perfect for desert lovers. It will take you right into the middle of nowhere, and even further!

These regions are away from civilisation - all you will find is nature and yourself. It is a short trip crossing the Great Victoria Desert but it gives you enough time to appreciate the real beauty of the Australian outback.

The big red kangaroo inhabits the area and will be spotted easily. Camels and emus are among the other species you will encounter. Photographers will take some of their greatest pictures here.

Four wheel driving, bush camping, this is a true adventure for those in search of something different!



Description

This is the perfect adventure for desert enthusiasts in search of a real change in scenery. Eight days to discover the Australian outback. This adventure will take you to the middle of nowhere, literally!

Before entering the great outback, we will stop in Kalgoorlie to have a look at the 'super-pit', the largest open cut gold mine in the Southern hemisphere.

Then, we will take a small detour to visit Lake Ballard where a whole community has been 'frozen' in time by artist Antony Gormley, "it is one of the most exciting artworks we will ever witness in this state..." (The West Australian Newspaper) "This installation on Lake Ballard has been an extraordinary experience for those who have journeyed to see it. The fifty abstracted black steel figures, cast from the bodies of West Australian people, reveal attitudes and emotions embedded in their posture." (Perth International Arts Festival)



This is where we leave the bitumen and start the Great Central Road.

We will fill up at Tjukayirla roadhouse before turning right onto a small track. The 'Connie Sue Highway' is an outback track which runs from Rawlinna on the Indian-Pacific Railway, to the Aboriginal community of Warburton on the Great Central Road.



The road is approximately 650 km long and running north-south, it lies entirely in the state of Western Australia and crosses the Nullarbor Plain and the Great Victoria Desert. Officially named the Rawlinna-Warburton Road, it is better known as the Connie Sue, after the daughter of Len Beadell, a famous 20th century surveyor and bushman.

This road, like many Len Beadell built, is a 'highway' in name only. It is remote and does not carry regular traffic. There is no known available ground-water and it is one of the longest stretches in Australia between fuel pumps. From there on, it's you and the desert, sand dunes, wildlife, horizons, sunsets, etc... We progress slowly on a very small track, enjoy the scenery, and stop at will. Camping is certainly one of the highlights of the journey; a nice meal, a glass of wine or cold beer in front of a campfire and no one around!



It is an easy trip despite the remoteness of the area. The track is rarely used by anyone and offers the sensation of a real adventure with all the challenges that crossing a desert entails.

This is a good opportunity to observe 'the big red' (kangaroo) in its most natural habitat as well as camels, emus and birds of prey.
